Phase 4 Parking Garage



- Parking lot has received striping
- Landscaping complete
- Phase 4 East Parking lot will be substantially complete 11/14/23
- Contractor Trailer will move out of the lower commercial lane on 11/17/23

Employee Parking Garage Construction



- Emergency Access
 Road and entrance/
 exits to the garage
 have been paved
- Fascia panel installation is ongoing
- Sidewalk, curb and gutter on the North side of Rickenbacker/ Airport Way is complete

Electric Boiler for Terminal

- Adding a 1,296 KW electric boiler as the primary heat source for the terminal, greatly reducing the airport's natural gas consumption
 - Existing natural gas-powered boilers will remain as auxiliary and back-up units
- New electric boiler will increase heating capacity for existing and future terminal expansion
- Phase 1 of construction started mid-October
 - Installation of boiler and all associated equipment by end of fall
- Project funded through discretionary grant funding through the FAA BIL-ATP




Airfield Projects

Taxiway Whisky

 Project is substantially complete and both runways are now open

Taxilane N and S Extension

 Final pavement markings are being installed this week



CONRAC

- The Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC) agreement with McAlvain was approved by City Council on 10/24
- This project will be split into three packages.
 Based on subcontractor bids, BOI and McAlvain will work through the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for each package:
 - Package #1 (Civil site work, demo and upfront utilities): Bid is being validated now
 - Package #2 (Deep foundation, procurement of long-lead items): Bid opening is 11/1
 - Package #3 (Vertical construction, terminal connector walkway): Timing TBD
- Once pricing is validated by the CMGC and BOI, the bid will be sent to City Council for approval





BOI Soon to be Powered by 100% Clean Electricity



 The City of Boise and Idaho Power announced a plan to transition the Boise Airport and Lander Street Water Renewal Facility to 100% clean electricity by participating in the Clean Energy Your Way program



Sun Country Joining BOI in 2024

- Sun Country announced they will begin 2x weekly service to Minneapolis-St Paul next June
- There will now be nine airline partners serving BOI



Southwest Expands Service

- Southwest's latest schedule announcement included:
 - A new route for the carrier from BOI, Burbank, CA
 - The return of weekend service to Dallas Love Field
 - Increased frequencies to Denver, Las Vegas, and Phoenix



Aircraft Incident

- In the early morning of October 12, a small twin-engine aircraft experienced a mechanical issue while taxiing, resulting in the aircraft rolling into a fence and catching fire
- The pilot safely exited the aircraft and Airport Operations and Boise Fire Department's Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting Apparatus (ARFF) responded
- The fire was suppressed and appropriate hazmat clean-up was completed within 24-hours
- No injuries were reported and there was no impact to airport operations
- Thank you to the entire BOI team for their rapid and thorough response



- In preparation for our upcoming Prime Concessionaire RFP that will be issued in January, BOI is holding a meet and greet for local businesses to meet and network with potential concessionaire partners
- Meet and Greet takes place tomorrow, 11/2, from 3-5pm

23-24 Winter Operations Preparations

- Airport Operations held its annual Winter Operations Pre-Season Briefing on October 17
- The local National Weather Service office provided a winter outlook, forecasting a 75-85% chance for a strong El Nino this season, which could mean warmer and drier than normal conditions



Fuel Farm Rezone Approved

- City of Boise Planning and Zoning Commission approved the rezone of BOI-owned parcels from M-1 (light industrial) to M-2 (heavy industrial) in anticipation of a possible fuel facility
- BoiseFuel LLC, a consortium of airline partners, hopes to construct, own and operate a fuel farm facility at BOI to increase onsite jet fuel capacity
- This rezone is in alignment with Boise City's Comprehensive Plan, BluePrint Boise





New Parking Operator

- Boise-based company, The Car Park, was awarded the 3-year contract and begins management duties today! (November 1st)
- The Car Park also operates BOI's valet parking
- The Boise Airport issued a Request for Proposals this summer to begin the process of selecting an operator for our parking facilities



2023 General Aviation Meeting






- BOI welcomed its GA tenants on 10/28 for a lunch and learn

- The public is invited to attend, and parking will be validated


September Enplanements




Boise Traffic/Capacity Trends


Boise Forward Looking Schedule

Over the next 6 months, BOI's flights are scheduled to be up 2%, while seats are scheduled to be up 1% compared to the same months in the prior year


