Master Plan Update

The master plan update is a comprehensive planning study that describes short, medium, and long-term development plans to meet future aviation demand. This update is being funded through a grant from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). There are several stages of the Master Plan Update Process:



Inventory of Existing Conditions

- This includes a review of the airport's facilities and operating environment.



Aviation Activity Forecasts

- This includes 20-year forecasts of passengers, aircraft operations, and other aviation activities.



Facility Requirements

- This is a technical analysis of existing facility data relative to forecast demand.



Alternatives Development and Evaluation

- Alternatives are developed and evaluated based on the facility requirements.
- Based on the results of evaluation and stakeholder input, the airport will select a preferred alternative.



Implementation and Financial Plan

- Develop plan on how to implement and fund the preferred alternative.



Airport Layout Plan

- Airport drawings depicting the proposed developments that make up the preferred alternative.



Final Master Plan Update Report

- The final report will be published and made available.

Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)

The airport has assembled a group of technical stakeholders to help review technical aspects of the Master Plan Update. Each TAC member has a direct professional connection or economic responsibility related to airport operations. The TAC, formed in early October, is made up of representatives of:

- Airlines, including passenger and cargo
- Rental car companies
- Food and retail concessionaires
- Military
- General Aviation
- Fixed-base operators (flight service and support)
- Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Control Tower and Airports District Office
- Transportation Security Administration (TSA) & Customs and Border Patrol (CBP)
- Idaho State Division of Aeronautics
- City and County Planning Departments
- City Council Liaison

The TAC will meet four times during the course of the planning process to review the technical aspects of the Master Plan Update and provide feedback on how the plan could affect and influence the services they provide.
