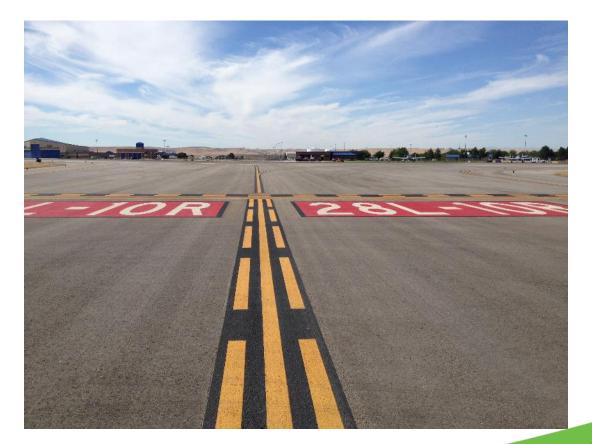


August Runway Closures

Triennial Disaster Exercise 2019

- 13 agencies participated with great collaboration during planning and execution
- Over 60 volunteers participated
- Airport and stakeholders identified constructive items to refine emergency plans





TSA Checkpoint Expansion

- A sixth lane was added to the security checkpoint at BOI
- TSA Precheck has moved to the west side of the checkpoint
- Known Crew Member has been re-routed through the bypass hallway during the peak morning hours





Alaska Airlines Adds Air Service

- Alaska announced they will begin twice-daily service to LAX
- Alaska will add an additional daily frequency to San Diego
 - From one daily departure to two
- Both changes will begin in March 2020





Scheduled Service to Lewiston Now Available

- Stout Flying Service Inc., based out of Lewiston, began twice-weekly service to Boise
- Scheduled service will operate on Monday and Friday



New Airport Amenity

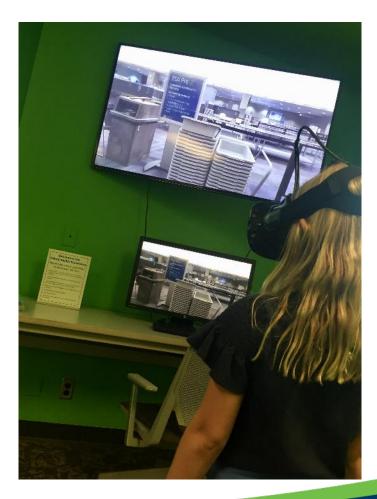
- Airport added a vending machine with baby products
- Wild Hare is a locally owned company, this is their first vending machine
- Located next to the Mamava, across from Bardenay





Virtual Reality Airport Experience

- Aimed to help individuals with autism familiarize themselves with the airport environment
- Available for free:
 - Boise Public Library
 - Download with personal VR equipment
- The project was a partnership with the City of Boise and Boise State University





ITD Economic Impact Assessment

- The Idaho Transportation Department is conducting an Economic Impact Study for Idaho's commercial airports
- The draft report states unofficial annual economic impact numbers for BOI are:
 - Jobs 18,760
 - Payroll \$709 million
 - Economic Output \$2.7 billion

Economic output is more than double the \$1.3 billion from the 2011 report





New Turbo Air Hangar

- Project is expected to be completed in October 2019
- Hangar will be approximately 30,000 Sq. Ft.
- Built with the ability to expand for additional office space





New Contracts and Leases

- Air Carrier Apron Pavement Rehabilitation
 - Status: Awarded to McAlvain Construction on 7/16/2019



General Aviation Town Hall Meeting

- Over 25 patrons attended
- Discussions were positive
- Format allowed for in-depth one-on-one interactions
- Timing seemed to work well with GA community





Passenger Recognition

- Director Hupp had the opportunity to meet with Maryalice Ford, 102, a former Women Airforce Service Pilot (WASP) during WWII

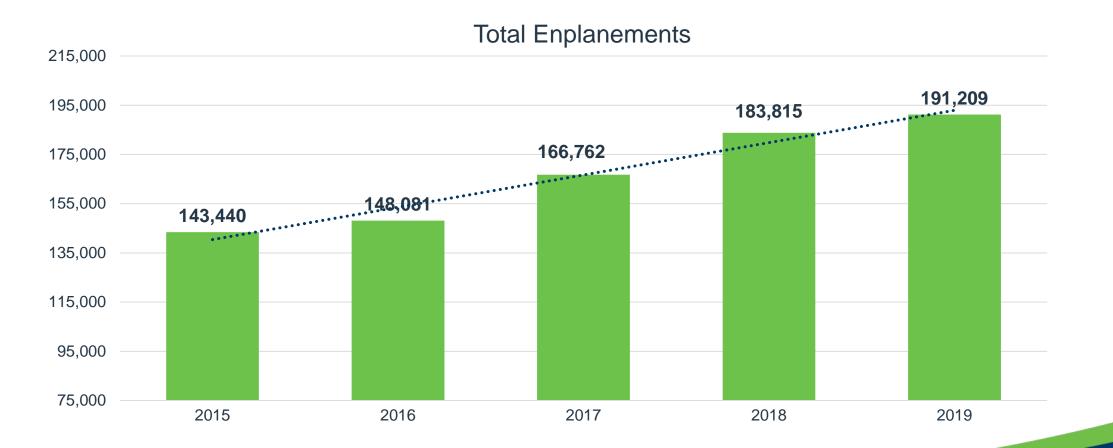

Up 4% July 2019 over July 2018





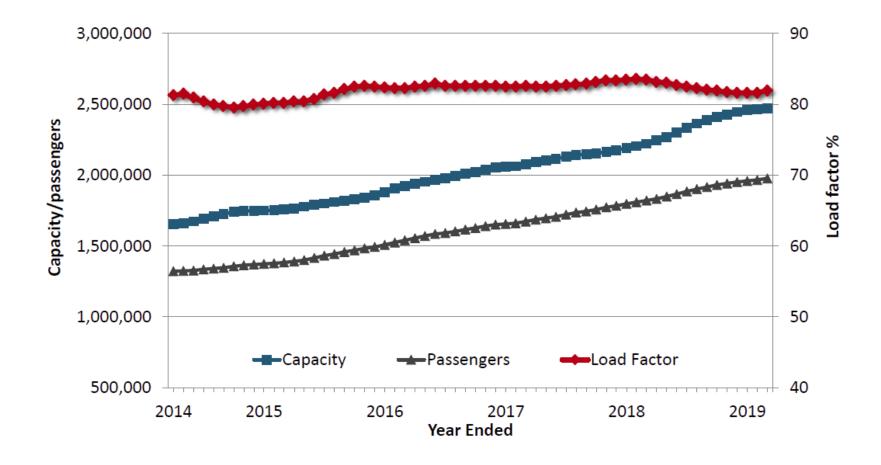
2019 Total Passengers

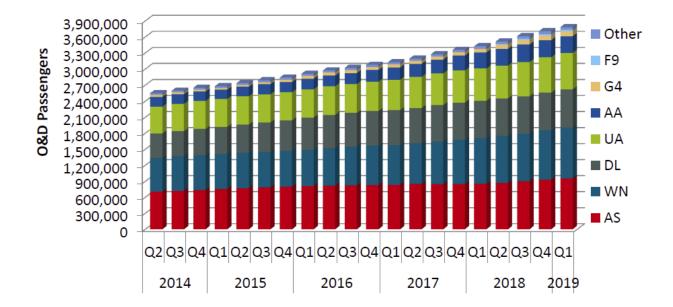

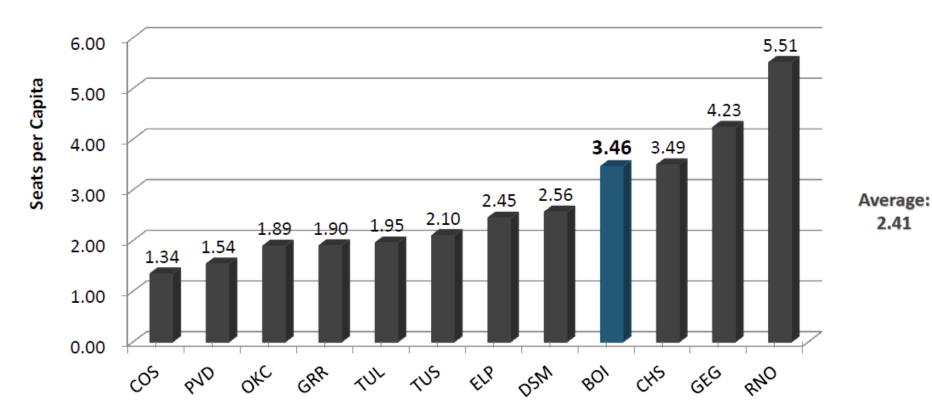

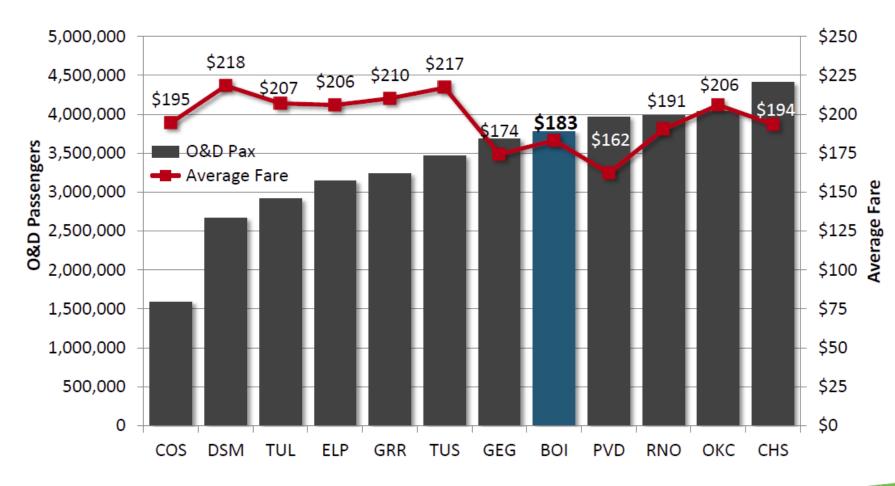
Seats Per Capita Comparison
