February Runway Closures

RWY 10R/28L:

2/7/22 & 2/14/22: Closed 8:00am – 12:00pm for FAA maintenance, BOI lighting maintenance and BOI surface sweeping/maintenance

• RWY 10L/28R:

2/7/22 & 2/14/22: Closed 12:00 – 4:00pm for FAA maintenance, BOI lighting maintenance and BOI surface sweeping/maintenance

Parking Garages Construction

- Parking Garage Office, Toll Plaza and Pedestrian Bridge Structure
 - COMMENCED: Footings, water bypass, drill rig mobilized, pier drilling and column embedding
 - COMPLETED: Demo of existing structures, foundation walls formed
- East Parking Garage
 - COMMENCED: Drilling for rammed aggregate piers and structural excavation (continue through March)
 - COMPLETED: Main stair/elevator tower excavated
- Update:
 - On February 22, a water line was struck during construction, temporarily impacting water service in the terminal for approx. 45 minutes. The airport remained open and operational during this outage.



Open Bid

- Cargo Apron and Taxiway S
 Widening
 - Bid opened 2/23
 - Construction work scheduled to start the end of March/beginning of April





Presidents' Day Travel

- BOI saw an uptick in travel over the Presidents' Day Weekend the first holiday after closing a large portion of the surface lot for construction
- Terminal parking reached capacity, but all passenger vehicles were accommodated using the Economy Lot




Spring Break Parking Strategy

- Preparations are underway to relocate all airport employees from the economy lot to allow for additional public parking
- Other options are also being explored to increase public parking capacity



Routes Americas


- Routes Americas was held in San Antonio, TX on February 15-17, 2022

- Director Hupp will also be participating in a Women in Leadership panel discussion at the event






Motorcade to Honor Fallen Veteran

- Efforts to honor the Veteran also received coverage on KTVB


January Enplanements
