August Runway Closures

10R/28L

Public Parking Garage Construction

Parking Office and Exit Plaza

- Reef Parking now occupying new office
- New exit plaza opened 8/17
- Old plaza was demolished to continue construction (Area B)

East Public Garage

- Slab has been placed on Area B
- Rebar has been placed on the eastern half of garage and awaiting concrete
- Construction of 5th level walls of the main stair tower is underway







Employee Parking Garage Construction







- Construction of footings in progress
- Forms for retaining wall on the east side of Stair/Elevator tower are being placed
- Rebar cages being placed for columns alongside the Stair/Elevator tower

TSA Checkpoint Expansion

- Project started 8/25/2022
- Anticipated duration: 180 days
- Adding a seventh screening lane and the ability to increase up to nine podiums
- Temporary walls are installed, and demolition of existing conditions will start soon, including relocating the automatic exit doors
- New terrazzo floor prep to start this month



Taxilane Sierra

Taxilane S Widening, New Cargo Apron

- Completed paving along the north side of Taxilane S for Phase 3
- Started Phase 4 of Taxilane S; widening along the south side
- Installation of the cargo apron lighting
- Asphalt Paving for the cargo apron Taxilane

Amazon Cargo Facility

- Working on the interior of the cargo facility building
- Graded and placing curb/gutter for facility parking lot

Gowen Rd Improvements – Cargo Facility Access Road

- Excavation and Grading of the new SE Cargo Facility Access Roads
- Placement of curb/gutter








Economy Lot Expansion

- Adding 350 parking spaces in the NW quadrant of the economy parking lot
- Planning to break ground September 12
- Anticipated completion date by mid-November, prior to Thanksgiving travel
- Project also includes adding drainage, lighting, and landscaping to this new area of the economy lot



Alaska/Horizon Glycol Tank

- Airline increasing their storage of deicing fluids
- Completed excavation for the tank pad
- Placed concrete for the tank pad



GA Asphalt Repairs

Jackson Jet Center

- Project started at the Jackson Jet Center Apron on 8/29
- Construction timeline: ~15 days

New City T-Hangers

- Will begin repairs along the Taxilane south of these T-Hangers beginning around 9/12
- Anticipated construction timeline: 5 days once work has begun
- During this time, access to these hangers will only be along the northern taxilane and no parking along the south side of the two eastern hangers will be permitted





Air Service Updates

- aha! Airlines filed for bankruptcy August 22
 - Inaugural flight to Reno was scheduled to take place August 31
- Alaska cited staffing shortages as they reduced operations on the following routes from BOI:
 - Austin, Chicago, Everett, Las Vegas, Los Angeles, and San Francisco





Boise Has Spirit!

- We welcomed Spirit Airlines' first nonstop flight to Las Vegas on August 5
- Spirit Airlines now offers a daily flight to Las Vegas
- Spirit Charitable Foundation donated \$20,000 to Global Gardens, a local nonprofit that supports refugee farmers in Boise, during the ribbon cutting







Avelo Celebration at BOI

- Avelo Airlines' one millionth customer flew into Boise on August 12 from Burbank, CA
- Avelo CEO, Andrew Levy, joined the flight and distributed a voucher for a free roundtrip ticket to everyone on the plane
- Boise's outbound passengers to Burbank were surprised with 10 vouchers hidden throughout their plane



Simple Flying's Most Recovered Airports

- Report compared October 2019 departing seats to October 2022
- The top 100 airports have a cumulative 94.9% of their 2019 capacity available this year
- 40 US airports have more capacity than they did pre-pandemic—with BOI coming in tenth place on a list of the fastest growing airports in the country

Airline Use and Lease Agreement

Renegotiating our lease agreement with airlines to better align with industry standards

- Includes gate use standards to utilize our gates more effectively
- Focus on ensuring the new agreement is beneficial for the airport and our airline partners

 Working towards a signed agreement with airlines finalized by 12/1 for approval by City Council in January 2023



Non-Aeronautical Development Rezone Approved

- City Council approved the Boise Airport's request to rezone approx. 75 acres from A-1 to M1-D on August 16
- These parcels are now included in our Master Development Agreement with Adler Industrial
- A-2 parcels were removed from the rezone request

2022 Triennial Emergency Exercise







- The Boise Airport completed a disaster-preparedness exercise on August 18th
- The drill is required by the FAA and refines the response, collaboration and interoperability of local emergency personnel and Boise Airport staff in the event of an aircraft accident




July Enplanements
