


March Commission Report Director's Update

Concessions Update

- Temporary walls are in place at active worksites.
- Substantial completion expected:
 - Boise Depot early April.
 - Sawtooth Essentials early May
 - Blue Sky Bagels, Pizza Hut, Protein Bar – early June
- Waffle Me Up/The Stil
 - Deaccessioning, the official removal of the Transport art piece, is occurring this month to start construction
 - Substantial completion of project expected in early June





Concourse B Family Restroom Project

- Rough in work for electrical, plumbing and HVAC continues.
- Partial dry wall inspections complete, water lines final connection nearly complete.
- Located next to B16, substantial completion scheduled for April.





Consolidated Rent-A-Car Center (ConRAC)

- Level 5 of the ready return garage is 1/3 complete.
- First concrete placement for the ramps complete.
- Customer service building topping off ceremony was February 25.





Concourse Development and Terminal Improvements Program Update

- Fentress, the program architect is working on:
 - Refining facility programming needs;
 - Basis of Design;
 - Preparing to begin Concourse A Visioning in March
- Jacobs Project Management, Owner's Representative:
 - Providing support to Concourse A planning and programming
 - Collaborated on CM/GC RFQ
- Construction Manager General Contractor (CM/GC):
 - RFQ released on January 31, responses due on March 12, 2025





Passenger Boarding Bridges




- In October, the FAA announced BOI was awarded \$9M passenger boarding bridges and associated equipment for Concourse A.
- Project is currently at 75% design.
- Will be formally bid this spring.




Master Plan Update

- Refining the scope of work for consultant InterVISTAS.
- Contract expected to begin in late March.
- The Master Plan update will be comprehensive of all components and facilities on the airside and landside.
- The current Master Plan was adopted in 2019.





GA Shade Hangar Update



- To prepare for the construction of Concourse A Apron, the southside GA shade hangar tenants will be relocated.
- Able to accommodate all shade hangar tenants in good standing.
- Potential relocation of the shade hangar, as well as additional opportunities for general aviation, will be considered in the upcoming master plan and the GA community will be invited to those discussions.



Frontier Airlines returning to BOI

- Starting May 15, Frontier Airlines will resume nonstop flights to Denver.
- Easy connections to countless destinations across the U.S. and Mexico





Customer Service Building Topping Off



- Last week at the ConRAC, the Boise Airport team, contractor McAlvain Companies and many subcontractors celebrated topping off the Customer Service Building with a lunch hosted by McAlvain.
- The final steel beam, signed by the team, was placed on the customer service building.
- Celebratory t-shirts, with an architectural rendering of the building, were given to all who worked on it.



Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Program

- The program supports people living with non-visible disabilities.
- Airport staff will be trained to assist people wearing the distinctive lanyards.

- Maribel Landeros Barroso was promoted from custodian to senior custodian.




Smooch a Pooch!

- Random Acts of Kindness Day celebrates kindness and encourages many different ways to demonstrate kindness in communities.












2025 Airfield Construction Phasing: 1A






2025 Airfield Construction Phasing: 1B











Runway 10L Reconstruction





RUNWAY 10L-28R PROFILE








